HAIR PROFESSIONAL











The title of Hair Professional can encompass two possible streams, both with their different practices and requirements: Hairdresser and Barber. Hairdressers need to be versatile and be able to jump between male and female clientele. In the Hair Professional apprenticeship, Hairdresser Apprentices will be able to shampoo and condition hair, cut hair using a range of techniques, style and finish hair to create a variety of looks and colour and lighten hair. Barber Apprentices, by contrast, are more specialised and tend to service only men. Barber Apprentices will be able to shampoo and condition hair, cut hair using barbering techniques, style and finish hair, cut facial hair into shape and provide shaving services for men.

Both Hairdressers and Barbers must have an intimate knowledge of hair types—from wispy and straight to thick and very curly—and be able to instantly work with a diverse set of hairstyles on demand. Perhaps most importantly, they should be able to communicate with clients to ensure they address their particular needs, demonstrate professionalism and values consistent with the profession and be able to work without supervision to a high level of precision.

2. ON-PROGRAMME

The Apprentice must have completed all on-programme elements in order to begin End-Point Assessment:



Continual development of Skills,

Behaviours



Off-the-Job Training Knowledge and



Level 2 **Diploma** for Hair **Professionals** (Hairdressing or Barbering)



Functional Skills* Level 1 English and Maths, and attempt to complete Level 2

3. GATEWAY

In order to enter into the Gateway phase, the Apprentice will need to have passed all the relevant Knowledge. Skills and Behaviour criteria as set out in the Apprenticeship Standard. After a meeting between the Apprentice, Employer and Training Provider, it will be the Employer's decision to place an Apprentice through End-Point Assessment. The Apprentice must have completed all on-programme elements in order to begin End-Point Assessment.

Resources. Training Qualifications UK has designed and developed a range of resources for this Apprenticeship Standard to help the Assessor and Apprentice in tracking progress of key Gateway components.



Functional Skills*

All Level 2 Apprenticeship Standards require the Apprentice to have successfully completed Level 1 Functional Skills in both English and maths qualifications (or equivalent) in order to progress through Gateway to undertake End-Point Assessment. Apprentices will also need to have at least attempted Level 2 Apprenticeship Standards.

As an End-Point Assessment Organisation (EPAO), Training Qualifications UK is required to see evidence of an Apprentice completing or attempting the relevant Functional Skills qualification assessments where necessary in order to verify Gateway requirements have been met.

4. END-POINT ASSESSMENT

The synoptic End-Point Assessment will consist of **one** component:



Practical Observation and Oral Questioning

The following units will be assessed:

- 1. Consultation
- 2. Shampoo, condition and treat the hair and scalp
- 3. Cut hair using a range of techniques
- 4. Style and finish hair using a range of techniques
- 5. Hairdressing: Colour and lighten hair. (The optional unit will be assessed onprogramme)

Barbering: Cut facial hair into shape and shaving services.
